Cultural Grant

The Cultural Grant Aid scheme of Japan was introduced in 1973 as part of the Official Development Assistance (ODA) for the purpose of contributing to the promotion of education and cultural activities. More than 120 countries throughout the world have expressed their gratitude for Japan's Cultural Grant Aid.

Cultural Grant Aid is used for various cultural and educational activities as well as the cost of equipment transportation and installation.

Nepal started receiving Japan's Cultural Grant Aid since 1977. Since then, Nepal has so far received such grant aid for 16 projects with total amount of 615.7 million Japanese yen.
